

6160-07 City & Guilds Level 3 Award in Direct Emergency Rescue and Recovery of Casualties from Confined Spaces



Course Aim

The aim of this course is to reflect the national occupational standard for directing the emergency rescue and recovery of casualties from confined spaces.

The course covers both water and non-water industry environments, including potable water and sewage treatment operations, drain and sewer cleaning, construction, utilities, engineering, manufacturing, petrochemical operations, mining, quarrying, and tunnelling.



Agenda

- Plan and prepare emergency operations for a rescue team
- Mobilise a rescue team and direct entry and exit to the confined space
- Monitor a rescue team to ensure procedures are followed
- Understand rescue team leader duties and responsibilities
- Understand the principles of working as a rescue team leader



Who Should Attend?

Suitable for anyone responsible for directing confined space rescue and recovery operations, including:

- Rescue Team Leaders
- Rescue Coordinators
- Entry Controllers (Top Persons)
- Confined Space Supervisors

Key responsibilities covered include planning emergency operations, mobilising rescue teams, directing rescue activities, monitoring communications, and reporting and securing sites following an incident.
